Parking and Staff Car Park

We have had an incident recently where a parent was almost hit by a car reversing back down the access road.

Urmston Active Neighbourhood—Last Thursday evening there was an extremely well attended meeting at The Venue in Urmston to consult residents about proposals for creating more cycle routes and making it easier for people to move around Manchester without cars. This plan is called the 'Bee Network' and funding has been sourced from central government to support this initiative.

The aims are as follows;

- More walking and cycling routes connecting communities
- Fully segregated routes along some of the busiest roads
- New crossings of busy roads or other physical barriers that divide communities
- Prioritising the movement of people over vehicles
- Environmentally friendly community spaces
