

Acre Hall Home Learning Plan

In order to provide as much learning as possible for all of our pupils during this difficult time, teachers will be running face to face learning for children of key workers and children classed as being 'vulnerable' who are in school whilst also managing remote learning for those who are not in school.

Remote learning provided will follow the usual curriculum and be very similar to tasks for children learning in school. The seesaw system will be used to access tasks and there will be a daily zoom call for each class. We have staggered these throughout the day so that if there is more than one child at home and limited access to digital devices, then turns can be taken to access zoom calls throughout the day. The zoom call will include Maths/English teaching input for the children. Class teachers will send zoom links via the teacher2parent system but daily timings will be as follows;

Year 3 Mrs Kan 9.30am – 10am

Year 4 Mrs Edwards 10am – 10.30am

Year4/5 Mr Stevenson 10.30am – 11am

Year 5 Miss Atherton 11am – 12 noon *

Year 6 Miss Thake 11am – 12 noon *

Nursery Mrs Jones 1pm -1.30pm

Reception Mrs Moore 1.30pm – 2pm

Reception/Y1 Miss Breslin 2pm – 2.30pm

Year 1 Miss Forlani 2.30pm to 3pm

Year 2 Mr Brierley 3pm – 3.30pm

*These sessions are longer as there will be more content for the children – we have checked that there are no pupils in these classes with siblings in the other class so there will be no issues with access to digital devices at the same times.

We have not organised class zoom calls for children in our Small Classes as they are classed as 'vulnerable' due to having an EHC plan so able to come to school. If however, parents choose not to send their child to school and wish for home learning to be in place with zoom calls whenever possible, please contact us and we will do our best to arrange this.

We have a small number of digital devices available for children to use if they do not have access to these at home. Please contact us if you would like to arrange this.

We know that you will be concerned about children missing full time education and respectfully ask that parents and carers do their best to keep up with learning tasks. During the initial lockdown period in March this year, we were astounded by the quality and amount of online learning completed by many children.
